#### Complaint

<u>Paragraph 5 Response</u>. Under Title IX in regard to a violation of sexual orientation for sporting events, it is my belief that Talladega Board of Education and Fayetteville High School are in violation of my daughters' rights as follows:

- 1. The Boy's baseball program has superior facilities to those being provided to the Girls Softball program in the following ways.
  - The Boys baseball field has a permanent structure from which they can announce games, sell concessions, store equipment, and provide restroom facilities for spectators that attend an event.

(The Girls softball program does not have any type of structure to announce games, sell concessions, store equipment, or provide easy access to restroom facilities for players and spectators.)

The boy's dugout is poured concrete on three sides, with a poured concrete roof
to provide shade and protection during a game. The Boys facility has a large well
maintained Chain link fence around the field of play to protect spectators from
errant throws and foul balls.

(The girls dug out is constructed of chain link fencing and has no shade available during spring and summer months. The girls filed has a small concrete block wall and a series of old, damaged, and loosely fitting netting to prevent injury to spectators.)

 The Boys Baseball program has been provided with sufficient concrete sidewalks, and new aluminum bleachers to allow spectators easy access to concessions, restrooms facilities, and the ability to view a game in a safe manner.

(The girl's facility has no concrete sidewalks, and the bleachers that are available to view games are old wooden structures that are unsafe to sit upon and present fall hazards to children and elderly people who come to spectate a game.)

 The boys program has easy access to weightlifting and training equipment as the equipment resides in the boy's football facilities.

(The girls have to make special arrangements to gain access to the equipment if it is available. The boys programs have preferential treatment toward the

equipment and this results in the girls being unable to use the equipment on a regular basis. This has led to a competitive disadvantage to the girls programs compared to other schools in our area.)

2. No readily accessible Locker room or changing facilities are available adjacent to the softball field, in addition the nearest restroom facility is more than 300 feet from the softball field and must be traversed over a sloped grass incline, then cross a wooden bridge with improper safety lighting, and then cross a gravel parking lot to gain access to facilities.

<u>Conclusion:</u> For the reason stated above I respectfully request that an investigation be launched against the Talladega Board of Education and Fayetteville High School to resolve what I believe to be a violation of my daughters civil rights under Title IX.
